You have a CHOICE:

French/German/Italian/Spanish 1D/1DX (LIFR/LIGM/LIIT/LISP) in the Linguistics Department

-reviews grammar and strengthens language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking)

-completes French/German/Italian/Spanish college language requirement within the LLP in the Ling. Dept.

-1D/1DX develops all language skills while focusing on conversational competence, cultural awareness, and the grammatical functions essential for communication. 1D/DX is taught by two instructors entirely in the target language. Course activities include cultural readings, videos, resources of the Internet, and computer-based materials.

French/German/Italian/Spanish 2A (LTFR/LTGM/LTIT/LTSP) in the Literature Department

-reviews grammar and strengthens language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking)

-is a prerequisite for all more advanced language courses in French/German/Italian/Spanish

-counts towards requirements for a minor in French Literature, German Literature, Italian Literature, and Spanish Literature

- Taught entirely in the target language, 2A is a five-unit intermediate-level language and culture course. 2A includes a thorough review of grammar and continues to stress all four language skills -- speaking, listening, reading, and writing -- through discussion of films, internet materials and a variety of cultural readings.

- If you take 1D/DX and you later decide to continue your language studies, or study abroad, you will still need to take 2A.
- Your choice of 1D/1DX or 2A may affect your eligibility for EAP or other study abroad programs.
